GOVERNOR LITTLE SIGNS HISTORICAL FINANCIAL LITERACY BILL AND PROCLAIMS APRIL FINANCIAL LITERACY MONTH

Boise, Idaho... Governor Brad Little has declared April Financial Literacy Month in Idaho. Further demonstrating his support of this important initiative, Governor Little, Superintendent of Public Instruction Debbie Critchfield, and Representative James Petzke of Meridian along with the members of the House and Senate celebrated a historic achievement with the passage of HB92, which ensures high school students take at least one course on personal finance and money management.

“New legislation introduced during this legislative session mandating financial literacy education for Idaho students demonstrates the commitment of state and local leaders to create forward momentum on this important initiative for the next generation of Idahoans,” said Director Patti Perkins

The **Idaho Department of Finance**, the **Idaho Financial Literacy Coalition**, and **Idaho Public Libraries** have joined together to sponsor Financial Literacy Month in April. The Idaho Financial Literacy Coalition (IFLC) (www.idahoflc.org), a partnership of private- and public-sector financial educators, is an affiliate of the Jump\$tart Coalition for Personal Financial Literacy. The Department and the IFLC are pleased to take part in Financial Literacy Month to draw attention to the importance of financial education for all Idahoans.

A proclamation ceremony with Governor Little and members of the **Idaho Financial Literacy Coalition** is planned for April 4th at the Idaho State Capitol. The ceremony will kick off Financial Literacy Month and include a presentation of awards to students who have won in selected categories of the **Piggy Bank Beauty Contest**.

The **Piggy Bank Beauty Contest**, organized annually by the IFLC, is a contest for Idaho students in 3rd through 6th grades. To be considered, students create and/or decorate a piggy bank using virtually any materials and their own ingenuity. Each of this year’s winners will receive a \$150 scholarship to start their very own college savings account, provided jointly by IFLC and member **IDeal – Idaho’s College Savings Program**. As the state-sponsored college savings program, IDeal’s mission is to help Idaho families save for future education goals in a tax-advantaged way. Contest winners, their parents and teachers are invited to the annual Financial Literacy Month proclamation celebration at the Governor’s office.

In support of the Governor’s proclamation throughout the month of April, the Department will release **new weekly episodes of its podcast, Insights by IDOF, each Wednesday on its website, www.finance.idaho.gov/insights/ and on most major podcast platforms**. This is a special lineup of content featuring renowned guest speakers and subject matter experts on a variety of financial and consumer protection topics including: **the transition to financial independence, cybersecurity and account takeover**

fraud, new financial literacy requirements for Idaho students, and key elements of Buy Now, Pay Later loans. Each weekly podcast release in April will be accompanied by a corresponding tip-of-the-week press release covering the highlights of each conversation.

In line with its mission to promote the education and protection of consumers, the Department also supports financial literacy throughout the year with the following events, partnerships, and efforts:

ROAST PORK LOIN WITH SWEET APPLE TOPPING

2 T. flour

1½ tsp. salt

1 tsp. dry mustard

½ tsp. sugar

¼ tsp. pepper

¼ tsp. ground sage

4-5 lbs. pork loin roast

Combine first 6 ingredients and rub over surface of pork. Put in roasting pan, fat side up. Roast at 325° for 1½ hours. Combine topping ingredients and spread over top of roast. Roast 1 hour longer, adding water to bottom of pan, if necessary. Use a meat thermometer to gauge cooking time.

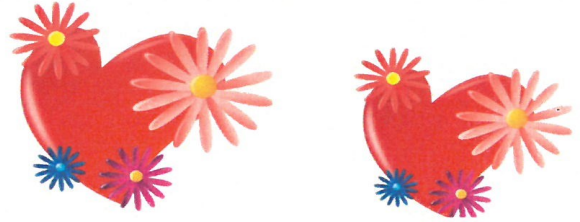

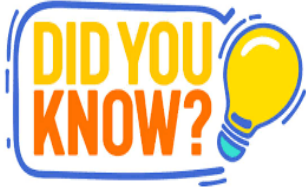

Under a grant project, the Area Agency on Aging provides outreach for federal and state Medicare subsidy programs. If you struggle paying for your Medicare healthcare costs, call your Area Agency on Aging, at (208) 522-5391, to learn more about your options, including the Medicare Savings Programs and “Extra Help”. The Medicare Savings Programs are state programs, through Health & Welfare, that help pay for some Medicare Part A (hospital) and Part B (medical) costs. “Extra Help” is a federal program, through Social Security, that helps with Medicare PartD (prescription drug) costs. These programs offer varying amounts of assistance that you can qualify for depending on your income and assets.

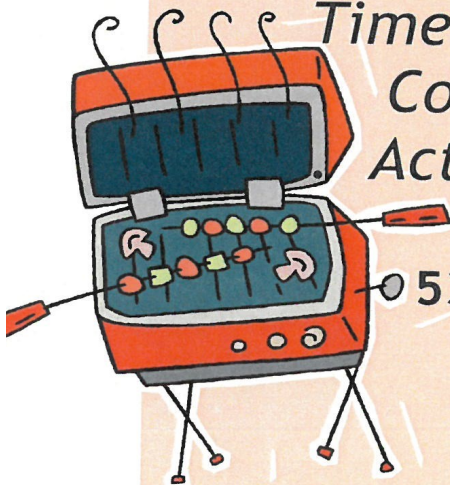

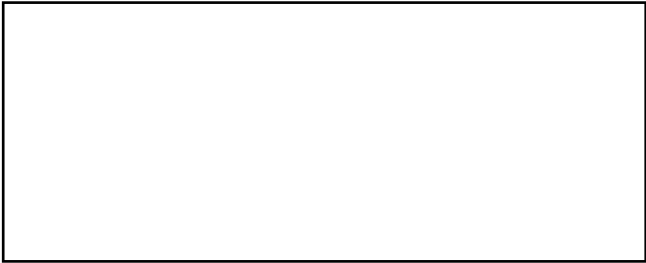
